Do You Speak WC? Decoding WC—Part I of II By: Adrene Thompson

"Claim accepted based on D&O from DCD that found injury to be AOE/COE. 64-yearold Farmer is s/p ORIF sx. TTD continues through NOV in a month. NCM to address LD release at that time. Current tx consist of MT/OT and monthly OV. As he approaches stability, an IME will be scheduled to address RTW/MMI/PPD. If unable to return to U&C duties, an FCE will be needed to address VR eligibility. Due to his age, an MSA is necessary to evaluate the claim for a full waiver settlement. SCF has been notified for joinder to limit exposure of PPD to first 104 weeks or in the event EE claims to be PTD. A WC5 was filed for stress/anxiety. DA confirmed that an IPE is scheduled"

This is a typical claim status report that one would come across at a WC claims review meeting.... lingo specific to WC industry. If you have trouble in the past, this list, containing the most used acronyms, should make your next meeting a walk in the park.
